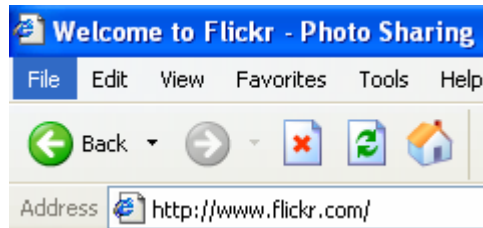


Flickr!

Uploading pictures

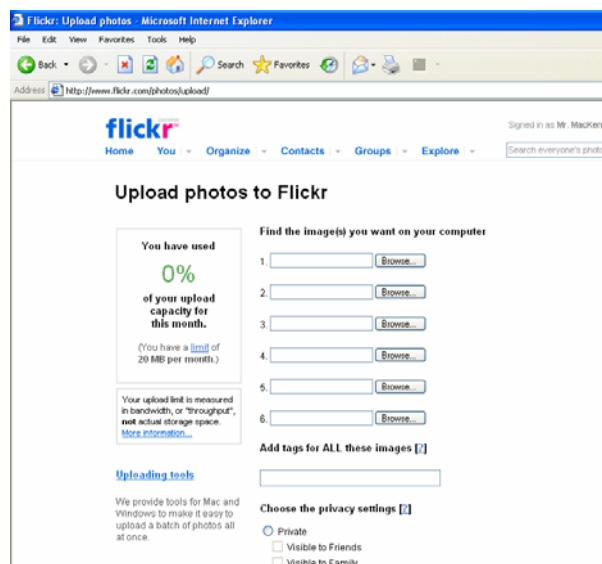
1) Click on the **home** link and then upload pictures



2) Click on the **Uploading** link.

3) Note the upload screen



4) Simply click the **browse** button and choose a file to upload. You will have to remember the **name of the photo** and the **place where it's saved**.

5) Once you've uploaded a picture, you'll be presented with a description and tags dialogue box.

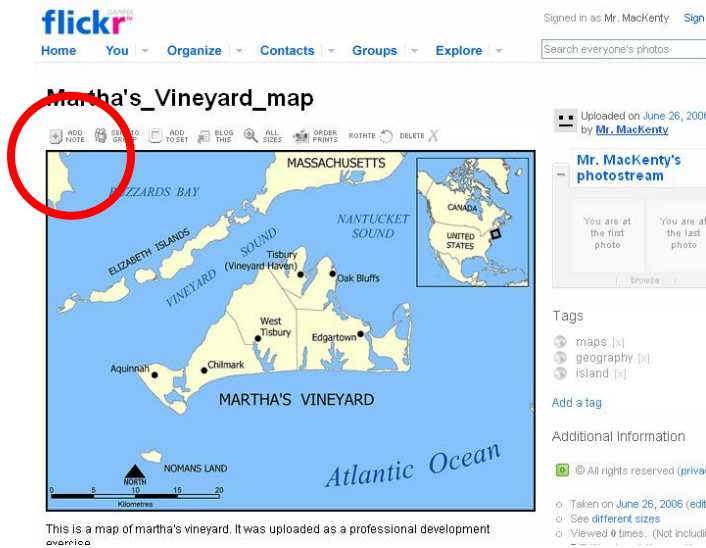

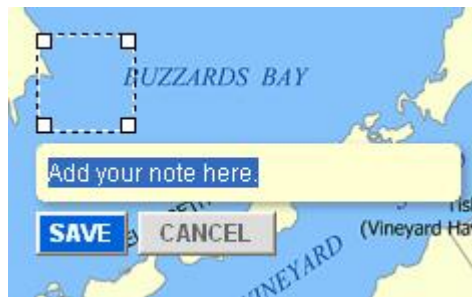
You can see I've uploaded a picture of Martha's Vineyard. The **title** is simply the title of the picture. The **description** is a verbose description of the picture.

The **tags** are organizing categories. If you have one or two pictures, you don't really need a lot of tags. However, if you have forty or fifty pictures, tags can become a very helpful. Tags are a space separated list, and a picture can belong to multiple tags.

6) Adding a note lets you comment on specific part of the picture. Click on the link.



Once you have clicked on **add note**, you'll see the following dialogue box. You can move the note around and stretch the corners.



When someone visits your flickr site, they will see your pictures. When they move the mouse in your pictures, they will see your notes! Pretty cool, huh?

7) Your flickr URL can be found by clicking on **you** on the top of the screen. You can give this URL to your friends and students.



8) Flickr meshes nicely with **blogs**. There are some really cool ways to get your pictures automatically added. If you have a blog, check the RSS the very bottom of the page!
